

## Run down of the first almost 5 weeks

I changed the guest pass age because last year it was 2 years old and up. That is not fair in my opinion and it was never that young of an age. Guest passes count towards individuals age 13+.

Week days have been slow but that is probably due to school still being in session. I expect it to pick up as the summer progresses.

If I can give some input for next year to help the village save money it would be to open only on weekends (Friday-Sunday) until Father's Day. The WWBC used to do that but after the village decided to use a management company, they opened everyday which honestly costs more than it's worth. There have been multiple times during the week that only one swimmer would show up but we are paying a lifeguard for the entire day. After Father's Day weekend, the lake should be open everyday because more people begin to come.

Hours without lifeguards so far: 27.5

5/23 (2 lifeguards + checker scheduled) - 7 hours (closed due to weather)

5/24 (2 lifeguards + checker scheduled) - 7 hours (closed due to weather)

5/28 - 7 hours (closed due to no lifeguard)

6/2 - 5 hours (closed early because lifeguard had to leave early and couldn't get someone to cover)

6/12 (1 lifeguard + checker scheduled) - 1.5 hours - closed early due to weather

Based on what members have said, this year's lifeguards have been the most attentive that the beach club has had in years. I honestly think starting with lifeguards that were new to the lake was beneficial.

Maintenance that may need to be taken care of/things that should be looked into being replaced:

- The raft has a hole in it
- Some boards should be replaced on the raft because they seem rotted.
  - The raft is an issue that either needs to be fixed or taken out of the water because it is a hazard with the hole, rotted boards that can break at any time, and the wood lifting where the ladder is.
  - There are 34 boards on the raft, to be safe I think all 34 should be replaced.
- One of the two lifeguard umbrellas are broken

I spoke with Mrs. Takeuchi and she explained how the original WWBC committee usually sponsors at least one of the events. They would be open to sponsoring the Ice Factory truck and also possibly part of the Camp-out. (Details of the events on following pages)

However, I also spoke to her about if they'd be open to helping replace the raft but the committee is not at this time because that would wipe their budget and they want to be able to sponsor future events within the coming years.

I called multiple times to inquire about the Casa Birria taco truck but no one ever got back to me which has led to me not including them in planning any of the events.

### What it entails:

**What it entails:**

We set up a bunch of different challenges/races/games. Because the Ice Factory was booked for that day, a bulk pack of ice pops would do well and ice pops is something many people enjoy. This is overall a low cost event, considering how much goes into it and gets done at the event.

Ideas for the competitions:

- Potato sack race
- Volleyball tournament
- Egg toss
- Sponge to bucket filling
- Tug of war

**Cost:**

2 Dozen Eggs	\$9
Potato Sacks	\$26 for a 6 pack
Rope	\$35 for 35 feet
Sponges	\$12 for 6
Ice Pops	\$15 for pack of 250
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Total	\$97

Any leftover ice pops can be used at future events



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**Arts & Craft Workshop with Ice Factory**

Last year WWBC hosted an event very similar to this and it was very liked and it has been requested from members for this year. It is planned for July 25

**What it entails:**

There are kits of arts and crafts, that come in packs of at least 20, that can be bought on amazon.

**Cost:**

Suncatchers Kit (20ct)	\$11
Sun Visors (35ct)	\$27
Wooden Magnets (36ct)	\$10
Ice Factory Truck (2hrs)	\$125
Estimate for each ice	\$3.50 (40) = 140

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Total	\$313 (if we pay for each ice)
	\$173 (if we have members pay for their own ice)

**What it entails:**

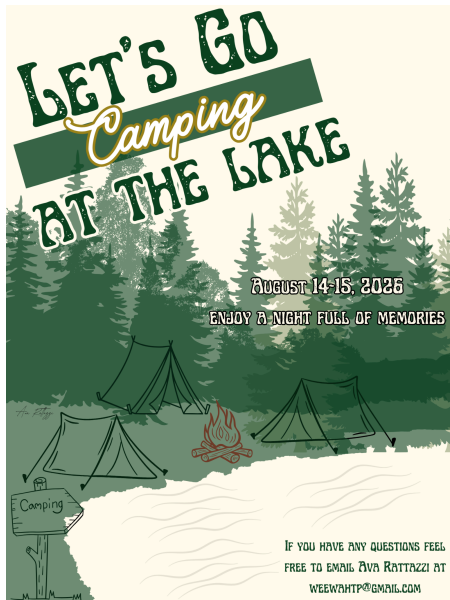
